Divine Liturgy of St. Basil (9 am) Purple Service Book - begins on
During the Entrance with the Gospel:
Apolytikion for the First Sunday of Great Lent: Thy pure image do we venerate, O good One, asking forgiveness of our sins, O Christ our God; for by Thine own will Thou didst ascend the Cross in Thy body, to save Thy creatures from the bondage of the enemy. Wherefore, with thankfulness we cry aloud to thee: Thou hast verily filled all with joy, since Thou didst come, O our Savior, to save the world
After the Entrance with the Gospel:
Resurrection Apolytikion-Tone 1: While the stone was sealed by the Jews, and the soldiers were guarding Thy most pure body, Thou didst arise on the third day, O Savior, granting life to the world. For which cause the heavenly powers cried aloud unto Thee, O giver of life. Glory to Thy Resurrection, O Christ, glory to Thy kingdom, glory to Thy providence, O Thou Who alone art the lover of mankind
Apolytikion for the First Sunday of Great Lent: (as above)
Apolytikion of St. Luke: Let us praise, etc
Kontakion for Sundays in Great Lent: To thee, the Champion Leader, do I offer thanks of victory, O Theotokos, thou who hast delivered me from terror; but as thou that hast that power invincible, O Theotokos, thou alone can set me free: from all forms of danger free me and deliver me, that I may cry unto thee: Hail, O Bride without Bridegroom
Communion Hymns: "Praise the Lord", "Of Thy Mystical Supper" and "I will take the cup"
Procession of the Holy Icons (children may join carrying icons; available for loan on the front row) The procession will stop for a litany in each of the four corners of the church,

with the chanters singing the **Apolytikion for the First Sunday of Great Lent**, (as above), before each stop and upon return to the solea.

The Synodicon or Affirmation of Faith:

Veneration Hymns: "The Great Prokeimenon", "O Give Thanks".. Choir/Chanters/All

The Prokeimenon in Tone 8 (from the Canticle of the Fathers):

Blessed art Thou, O Lord God of our Fathers and praised and glorified is Thy Name forever!

For Thou art just in all that Thou hast done for us!

The Reading is from the Epistle of the Holy Apostle Paul to the Hebrews (11:24-26,32-40)

Brethren, by faith Moses, when he was grown up, refused to be called the son of Pharoah's daughter, choosing rather to share ill-treatment with the people of God than to enjoy the fleeting pleasures of sin. And what more shall I say? For time would fail me to tell of Gideon, Barak, Samson, Jephthah, of David and Samuel and the prophets—who through faith conquered kingdoms, enforced justice, received promises, stopped the mouths of lions, quenched raging fire, escaped the edge of the sword, won strength out of weakness, became mighty in war, put foreign enemies to flight. Women received their dead by resurrection. Some were tortured, refusing to accept release, that they might rise again to a better life. Others suffered mocking and scourging, and even chains and imprisonment. They were stoned, they were sawn in two, they were killed with the sword; they went about in skins of sheep and goats, destitute, afflicted, ill-treated, of whom the world was not worthy—wandering over deserts and mountains, and in dens and caves of the earth. And in all these, though well attested by their faith, did not receive what was promised, since God had foreseen something better for us, that apart from us they should not be made perfect.

Moses and Aaron among His priests, and Samuel among them that call upon His Name.

They called upon the Lord, and He hearkened unto them.

The Holy Gospel according to St. John (1:43-51)

At that time, Jesus decided to go to Galilee. And he found Philip and said to him, "Follow me." Now Philip was from Bethsaida, the city of Andrew and Peter. Philip found Nathanael, and said to him, "We have found him of whom Moses in the law and also the prophets wrote, Jesus of Nazareth, the son of Joseph." Nathanael said to him, "Can anything good come out of Nazareth?" Philip said to him, "Come and see." Jesus saw Nathanael coming to him, and said of him, "Behold, an Israelite indeed, in whom is no guile!" Nathanael said to Jesus, "How do you know me?" Jesus answered him, "Before Philip called you, when you were under the fig tree, I saw you." Nathanael answered him, "Rabbi, you are the Son of God! You are the King of Israel!" Jesus answered him, "Because I said to you, 'I saw you under the fig tree,' do you believe? You shall see greater things than these." And Jesus said to him, "Truly, truly, I say to you, you will see heaven opened, and the angels of God ascending and descending upon the Son of man."
