oly and Great Lent returns to us this month on the 17th, bringing "great profit to our souls." The order of services during Lent is found in the book of the Triodion, which contains some of the most sublime and poignant hymnography of the year. Historically, Great Lent developed from a simpler program of comparatively modest baptismal preparation into the God-given greatness of what we have now: 4 Pre-Lentan

Sundays (a. Publican & Pharisee; b. Prodigal; c. Meatfare; d. Cheesefare), the 40 days of Lent proper, and then Holy Week. Through the labor of fasting, prayer and almsgiving, Great Lent is a season for growth in piety and understanding -but we have to seize the opportunity with preparation and care. In His parables, our Lord warned us we had to be watchful, let we be found unready and asleep.


The Church wisely readies us with the "themes" of each Sunday. The first God-breathed direction we have already heard at the

Vespers of the Sunday of the Publican and Pharisee: we are exhorted to make our Lentan prayer like the Publican "God be merciful unto me a sinner" and avoid self-exaltation for our prayers and fasting. In the Sunday of the Prodigal, we are also to remember that repentance is not a journey to punishment but a homecoming to a loving Father. On Meatfare and Cheesefare we commemorate the expulsion from Paradise, the souls of the departed and contemplate how we must all give an answer for ourselves before God's judgment seat. We conclude our preparation for Lent by lining up and forgiving one another and asking forgiveness.

From the Sunday of the Publican & Pharisee (and

continuing till the end of Lent) after the Orthros gospel, we chant the penitential troparia "Open to me the gates of repentance..." of repentance..." and "When I the hapless one..." in place of the filled center of the Sunday Orthros service -these beautiful troparia add to it the "bright-sorrowfulness" of the season. We have not lost sight of we draw near to the Resurrection we know that we must receive it

"Make straight for me the paths normal post-gospel hymnography. The Resurrection gospel is the joythe Resurrection -far from it-but as with repentance.

Lenten almsgiving opportunities:

As we look forward to the Lenten season, our Archdiocese will provide several opportunities to engage with almsgiving. We expect the following:

- -Food for Hungry program will run throughout Lent. Boxes will be due by the 2nd Sunday after Lent (5/19)
- -Seminarian Fund appeal in support seminarians and their families on the Sunday of Orthodoxy (3/24).
- -Patriarchate relief work appeal on Palm Sunday. The specific focus for this year has not been announced.

Lent is also a fitting time to re-examine the Church's perspective on the spiritual need for and benefits of our practices of tithing and almsgiving.

• Over Christmas Holiday break, St. Nektarios Nursery and Primary School broke ground for a new 6th grade classroom and it was built by the first day of school February 5, 2024. When the 5th graders finished school in December they thought they would be having their classes under the mango trees when they advanced to the 6th grade. The students and teachers are very happy in their new classroom. At the end of 2024 we hope to build the 7th grade and final classroom at the school. Also the two kindergarten classrooms that were built early in 2023 were able to be totally finished by adding a cement floor and plastering/painting all the



walls. The students, parents and teachers are very happy that naps are no longer on dirt floors. Now the students and teachers are much more comfortable at school and ready to learn. Thank you to everyone who donated so generously for this huge construction project.

St Luke parishioners have sponsored 58 students for all 3 terms of 2024. There are many grateful parents who know their child will not have any interruptions for the entire school year. We are called "St Luke Church in the Rocky Mountains of the US" and they send their prayers of thanksgiving to all of you. Fr George blessed all the students, teachers and parents on the first day of school.

The Community Children's Library had many special programs over the Christmas Holiday break to keep the children interested in reading and learning. Our librarian Daniel organized a Christmas party on the last day of school with singing and dancing, crafts, sports and games for all. This was the first party ever held at the school and fun was had by all. Children in the community who do not attend our school also were invited and tours of the library were given to the children and their parents. Now everyone is hoping for a Pascha party.!

Swahili is now the national language of the 5 countries that make up Eastern Africa. All schools are required to teach Swahili. We are adding many books in Swahili to the Community Children's Library to assist the teachers and students in their learning of this new language.
